

The college collects feedback oncurrent syllabi from the students. There were 380 respondents from various departments.

Majority of the students reported the course contents met with their expectations. More than 82% of the students felt that the present syllabi fulfilled their learning needs and that the structure of the syllabi was systematic. More than 80% of the respondents agreed that the contents were illustrated with adequate examples, course exposed them to new knowledge and practices, the level of the course was adequate and the course content had contemporary relevance. About 68% of the students felt that the course was useful to them in getting a job. More than 65% of the respondents agreed that the topics included were of equal importance, which is reflected in the Fig.-2.

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
